I was dispatched to the report of a subject with a gun pointing it at another person near the intersection of SE 82nd Ave / Powell Blvd. Multiple people called 911 to report the incident and were giving conflicting information, to include different clothing descriptions and where the subject with the gun was going. One witness reported that the subject with the gun was walking backwards and away from the other subject, and that the other subject was following the subject with the gun shouting "Shoot me! Shoot me!"

I arrived in the area as other officers, including Officer Bruders, stopped a subject possibly involved in the parking lot of the Unicorn Motel. See Officer Bruders' report for details.

I drove to the area of O'Reilly's Auto Parts where the "victim" was last seen. I drove by a subject matching the description of the "victim" (White male, balding, wearing a black t-shirt) but he did not flag me down. I drove around the block, came back to O'Reilly's and was contacted by a witness to the incident who told me that the White male in the black shirt was in fact the person who had the gun pointed at him.

I contacted this subject, JACOB BROWN. BROWN told me that a stranger pointed the gun at him for no reason. BROWN said that he was in front of the 7-11 at SE 82/Powell "asking people for change." He said he may have been a "little aggressive" towards the subject with the gun. BROWN was very calm as if not impacted by the subject who had pointed a gun at him.

Officers in the lot of the Unicorn Motel asked if a witness could be transported to their location to do a "show up" with the subject they had stopped. BROWN told me he would likely not recognize the subject because he was staring at the gun. A separate witness, MICHAEL LARAMEE, said he would likely recognize the subject if he saw him. LARAMEE was inside O'Reilly's working when he heard a customer say there was a subject in front of the store with a gun. LARAMEE went outside and saw a White male, 5'8", 160 lbs, wearing a gray shirt and blue jeans, walking backwards away from BROWN. LARAMEE said the subject was putting something into the small of his back, but he never saw what the subject was putting there. LARAMEE said that another employee took a photograph of the subject with the gun. LARAMEE later emailed me the photograph, which I printed out and attached to this report.

There were additional witnesses in the parking lot who were asking to leave. I spoke with WILLIAM ROBERTS. ROBERTS said he saw BROWN and the subject with the gun "exchanging words with one another." The subject with the gun put it behind his back while walking away from BROWN. ROBERTS thought the subject with the gun got onto a northbound bus.

JENNIFER ROBERTS did not see the initial argument between BROWN and the subject with the gun. However, she said that the subject with the gun was walking backwards and away from BROWN while pointing the gun at him. BROWN was following the guy with the gun and taunting him by saying "Come on! What are you going to do, shoot me?"

I spoke with BROWN again to get a more detailed story. BROWN told me that the guy pointed a gun at him then started walking away from the 7-11. BROWN admitted to following the subject with the gun and yelling at him. BROWN told me he yelled "Why don't you shoot me?!" I asked why he followed a subject who was pointing a gun at him and obviously trying to get away. BROWN did not have a good answer but

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said "In my world, you don't pull a gun on a person and not shoot them." I asked him to clarify. He felt it was his duty to instruct the gentleman with the gun that he is required to shoot someone if he pulls it out. BROWN said the subject with the gun said he had a concealed weapons permit.

I asked BROWN if the interaction between him and the other subject was ever physical and he said no. I asked him if he was afraid that he was going to be shot by the subject and he said no. BROWN then left the area without inquiring further.

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I was notified that witnesses doing the "show up" did not identify the subject stopped in the Unicorn Motel parking lot as the subject with the gun. He was then released.

I was notified that the subject with the gun may have pointed it at two Trimet drivers near SE 82nd Ave / Powell Blvd. Deputy Ciobanasiu and Deputy Zishka with Transit Police responded and interviewed the bus drivers. See their report under this case number for further.

While in the parking lot of the 7-11, I was contacted by a woman who said she witnessed the incident. MALONI BACA said that she observed BROWN harassing a younger male, his wife, and their young (maybe 5 year old) daughter in front of the store. The family then went inside the 7-11. BACA was inside the 7-11 and overheard the male say that BROWN was harassing him outside. The male also said that he had a concealed weapons permit. BACA said that she could see BROWN waiting outside of the store for the male subject to exit. BACA said that when the male and his family exited the store, BROWN instantly got in the male's face and started yelling at him. At some point the man pulled out his gun and pointed it at BROWN while giving him commands to leave him alone. The man backed away from BROWN while pointing the gun at him. BACA said that BROWN followed the male while continuing to yell at him. BACA said that BROWN followed the man and his family for about three blocks before BROWN turned around and left the family alone. BACA said it was obvious that BROWN was the instigator and the problem.

I went into the 7-11 and spoke with employee BHIM RAI. RAI said that prior to the incident with the gun, BROWN got into RAI'S face and was being aggressive towards him. RAI said that he witnessed BROWN yell at the male and his family when they were entering the 7-11. RAI said the male was with his pregnant wife and young child. RAI said the male and his family stayed inside the 7-11 for a couple minutes waiting for BROWN to leave the area but BROWN remained outside the store looking inside and intimidating the male. After a few minutes it appeared as if BROWN had left the area so the man and his family exited the store. When the male exited the store, BROWN appeared out of no where and began yelling at the male again. RAI did not see anything else and never saw a gun.

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As of this report I have been unable to identify the male with the gun or his family members. I am unaware if they called the police to report the incident.

I'm reporting this incident on a Special Report because BROWN is not the victim of a crime and I do not know who the potential victim is.

Nothing further at this time.
